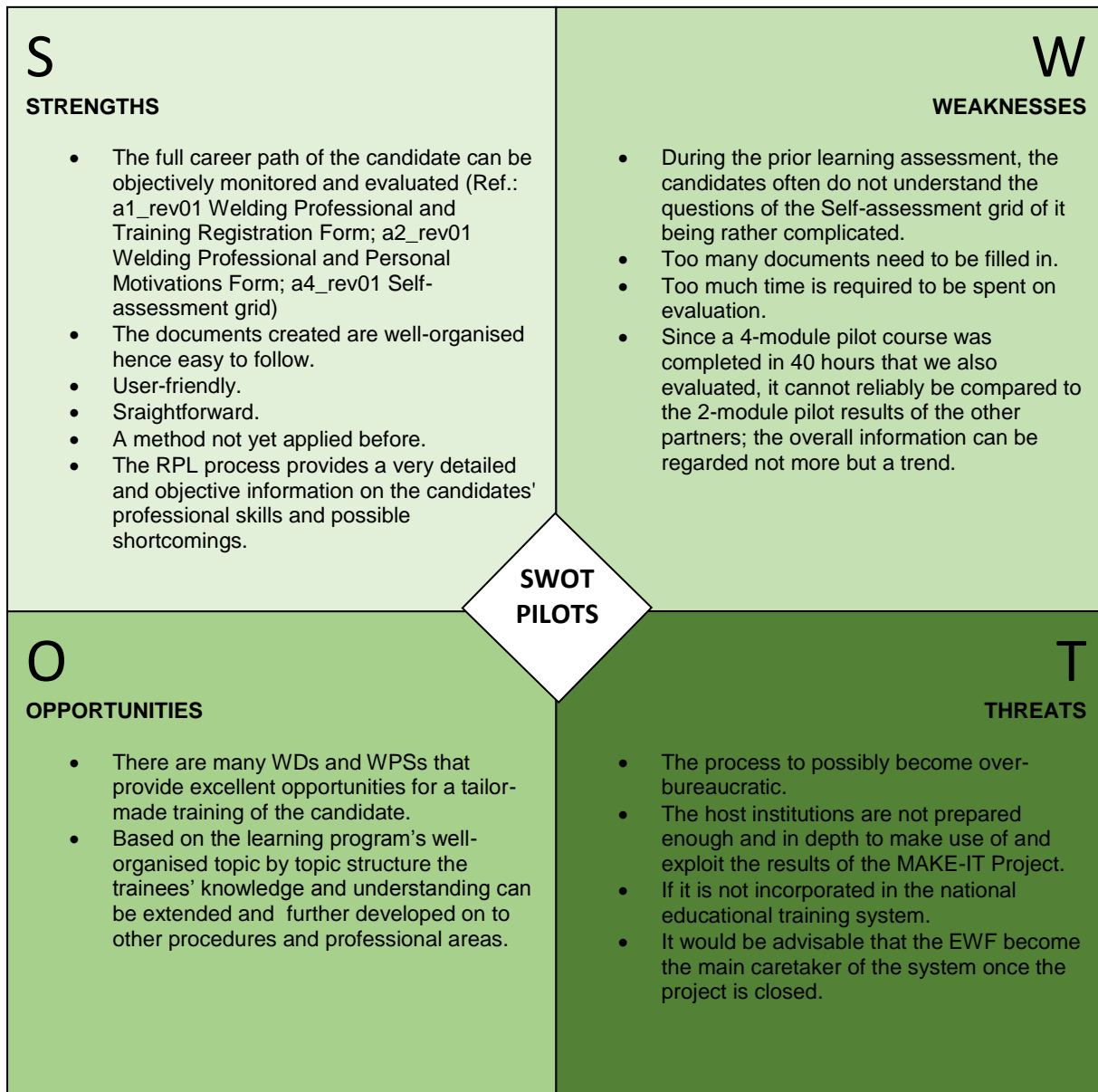

Final comments:

The consensus between the participants in the Roundtable was that:

The roundtable session in Hungary was organized by MÁTRAI Welding Technique and Vocational Training Ltd. where the invitees were VET providers as well as some other organizations. (Please see the *Presence list*). The roundtable session was led by Mr. Ferenc Benus, owner and CEO of MÁTRAI.

The aim of the roundtable session, among others, was to discuss the results obtained by the pilot activities, with special focus on the EWP LOs Standard Pilots and the RPL Tools Pilots.

The RPL process in fact provides detailed information on the candidates' professional skills and possible shortcomings.

One issue in the agenda was the assessment and discussion of the pilot-results about teaching and communication in the classroom; all of these provided enough examples and experiences to formulate MÁTRAI's opinion.

One issue in the roundtable agenda, was the constataion about the usefulness of a face-to-face meeting/communication/discussion, since it gave opportunity to think, discuss and exchange opinion and finally draw conclusion together. Since MATRAI tested all four modules in the pilots, it was a great opportunity to draw a general conclusions and form an opinion based on all that was experienced.

According to the results of the roundtable discussions we can state:

- The SWOT analyses gave very good and objective inputs to the roundtable discussion and as a special type of objective data gathering it should be used in the future as well;
- Minor changes would be necessary (e.g. repeat/rework some of the photos);
- Some system-units (e.g module 1 and 4) discussed during the roundtable session need small scale reorganization/rework e.g. establishing links (even hyperlink); between photos, videos and the solutions of the exercise
- The regulation of the RPL activities is correct and ready for usage;
- LOs are suitable for assessing the candidates' current level of knowledge, maybe skills as well;
- LOs make it possible for the person to start or join to the adequate welding course;
- This system should work as a closed IT system;

The Roundtable as a method for improvement should be used in the future as a special tool for improvement of pedagogical processes as well.
